Make your next contact your Georgia Representative and Senator

Ask them to support HB 706 and remove the license plate fees for the Amateur Radio License Plate!

Tell your Representative and Senator you are one of over 19,000 Amateur Radio Operators in the State of Georgia and ask them to support and help pass <u>House Bill 706</u> sponsored by Alan Powell (33) and reinstate the Amateur Radio License Plate without the special license plate fees.

Write them an email (use the template below or your own words) and tell them

- Your call sign and you're a member ______ Radio Club, one of more than 60 clubs in the state that help's train and provide community support and emergency services by providing access to its area communications network.
 - Specifically mention your participation in ARES or AuxComm or SkyWarn or CERT and another programs.
- Amateur Radio is now included in the FEMA Guide for National Emergency Preparedness. (Read ARRL QST June 2023 edition, page 78).
- You are self-supporting, buying and maintaining your own equipment for your base station and mobile/portable station for emergency response for county, state and federal programs. (Mention your training and practice, tell them about your last NET, POTA, contest, completed all county, state, country certification requirements and how you set up and make contacts).
 - o If you are a Veteran, tell them your skills learned in the military and now apply as an Amateur Radio Operator. (Communications, technical, tactical support, etc.).

Make the email contact at least 3 or 4 more times this year.

- When the General Assembly convenes next January 2024, call their office every week as you can until it's passed.

Working together as an Amateur Radio community, it can be done. Share this with your family and friends asking for their support contacting their Representative and Senator as well.

The best part is when it passes, **ARRL Georgia Section will design a new Georgia Amateur Radio license** plate!
